"This House is of the opinion that the Government of Pakistan must ensure safe recovery of Baloch missing persons. As stated by Supreme Court of Pakistan, the evidence in many cases points towards Frontier Corps (FC) and other law enforcement agencies. The growing frustration among the people of Balochistan demands that the problem must be solved via civilized and democratic manner."

4. **Mr Shahzar Illahi** (YP56-SINDH09) Youth Leader of Opposition would like to move the following resolution:

"This house, cognizant of the possible human rights violations of the recently approved Pakistan Protection Ordinance which has come into effect, is of the opinion that an External Complaint Agency be established by the federal government with branches in all major districts of the country which would provide citizens an opportunity to lodge complaints against misconduct and unnecessary aggression against innocent civilians by law enforcement agencies. This could ultimately prove to become a decisive factor in analyzing the success of the PPO and its human right violation. A stronger stance against a black law would thus be made in the future."

5. **Ms. Rahy Farooq** (YP11-ICT01) and **Mr. Zain Ul Hassan** (YP47-Punjab28) would like to move the following resolution:

"This house is of the opinion that for the betterment of WAPDA, it should not be privatized. This house believes that structural reforms like proper management of electricity line theft, clearance of bills and debts especially by the government institutions will make it more docile and ease the financial position of WAPDA resulting in provision of better electricity, coping up with the power crisis and the circular debt."
